Does Wednesday need a capital letter?	Yes
Does autumn need a capital letter?	No
Why does McDonald's need a capital?	Because it is a company name
Which pronoun needs a capital letter?	I

Section 2: Direct Speech

What punctuation is used to show when a character is talking?	Inverted commas
When do you need to start a new line?	Every time someone new starts speaking
Where should the inverted commas (speech marks) go?	At the start and end of the words being spoken
What punctuation could you use inside the inverted commas (speech marks)?	Comma, question mark or exclamation mark
When a new person is speaking what do you need to do?	Start a new line
When do you use inverted commas in your writing?	When someone is talking

What is a noun?	Name of a person, place, thing or idea
What is a verb?	Shows an action or a state of being
What is an adjective?	Describes, modifies or gives more information about a noun or pronoun
What is an interjection?	A word or phrase which expresses a strong emotion
What is a conjunction?	Joins two words, ideas, phrases together and show how they are connected
Which part of speech shows a strong emotion?	Interjection
What type of word describes a noun?	Adjective
Table, is what type of word?	Noun

What are fronted adverbials used for?	They are words or phrases at the start of a sentence which describe the action
What punctuation should be used after a fronted adverbial?	Comma
Give four types of fronted adverbials.	Time, place, manner, frequency
Give an example of an adverb of manner.	Sadly, slowly, politely
Give an example of a time fronted adverbial.	Immediately, yesterday, in the morning
What are the phrases at the beginning of a sentence called?	Fronted adverbials
