

Summer Practise – planning for the best outcomes possible

Age Range: KS3

During the Home Learning provision, we have identified essential learning that would be most helpful whilst you are at home. If you would like to continue to work on these aspects during the summer holidays, we have collated some links that will be available on CATLive.co.uk for you to access. These will provide a way for you to support your child to become increasingly competent in those essentials. However, please be reassured, this is not an expectation! We simply want to provide some opportunities for those families who wish to take it up, for a little bit of extra practise.

**TO KNOW BY THE END OF JULY (these were identified on the weekly Maths and English home learning overviews)
If all else fails, focus on these fundamentals and you will set your children up beautifully for return to school!**

Reading

Read the common exception words for Years 5 and 6.

READ EVERY DAY! We cannot stress that enough!

Spelling

Automatic recall of spelling of Year 5 and 6 common exception words and practise the KS3 word list.

Maths

*Recall multiplication and division facts for the times tables up to 12x12, e.g. $6 \times 5 = 30$ $30 \div 5 = 6$ $30 \div 6 = 5$ as well as $60 \times 5 = 300$ and $0.6 \times 0.5 = 0.3$

*Recall prime numbers up to 50. A prime number is a number that is divisible only by itself and 1 (e.g. 2, 3, 5, 7, 11)

*Recognise square numbers up to 144. A square number is the product of a number multiplied by itself, e.g. $1 \times 1 = 1$, $2 \times 2 = 4$, $3 \times 3 = 9$, $4 \times 4 = 16$

Fraction, decimal and percentage equivalents for Year 7:

$\frac{1}{2}$	0.5	50%
$\frac{1}{4}$	0.25	25%
$\frac{1}{10}$	0.1	10%
$\frac{1}{5}$	0.2	20%
$\frac{1}{3}$	0.3	33.3%

Fraction, decimal and percentage equivalents for Year 8:

$\frac{1}{10}$	0.1	10%
$\frac{1}{5}$	0.2	20%
$\frac{1}{3}$	0.3	33.3%
$\frac{1}{100}$	0.01	1%
$\frac{1}{20}$	0.05	5%
$\frac{1}{8}$	0.125	0.125%

Spelling Principles

By the end of July, all children in Year 6 and above should know a variety of spelling principles in the National Curriculum which can be downloaded [here](#) (see p18 - 23). We would recommend you particularly focus on the homophones, p 21-22. All children should also be confidently spelling the word list for years 5 and 6 on p 23.

Common Exception Words

A great way to secure both spelling and reading of Common Exception Words is to use a dictation passage. Dictation passages are accessed via the Summer Practise section on CATLive, learners at KS3 should be able to read and spell the words the word from the Year 5/6 list (in bold) in these passages. You should read the passage aloud and pause on the **bold** words and allow enough time for your child to write it down. Any words that are misspelt should be your focus before they return to school.

Read, read and.....read some more!!

Maths Practise and Flashbacks

White Rose Maths provide a series of 'Flashbacks', these are Powerpoints that provide quick recall with 3 or 4 simple questions per slide for children to attempt according to an area of Mathematical knowledge. These are particularly useful for recalling knowledge, identifying strengths and highlighting areas that need attention from the KS3 curriculum.
