What is the name of the Cockney flower girl in “Pygmalion”?	Eliza Doolittle.
Who says: “I stole her heart away and put ice in its place”?	Miss Havisham.
Who describes themselves as: “a blot upon the earth from which all men fled and whom all men disowned”?	The Monster (from “Frankenstein”)
Who says: “A woman who utters such depressing and disgusting sounds has no right to be anywhere — no right to live”?	Henry Higgins.
What is the name of the boy Miss Havisham choses to have his heart broken by Estella?	Pip.
What has aged Miss Havisham?	Her long life without sunlight.
What does Miss Havisham wear?	A wedding dress.
What happened to Miss Havisham on her wedding day?	She was jilted (abandoned) at the altar.
Where does Miss Havisham live?	In a ruined mansion (Satis House).
In “Pygmalion”, where does the Cockney flower girl (Eliza Doolittle) work?	Covent Garden.
Who doesn’t want Henry Higgins in their house when they have company?	His own mother.
What does Victor Frankenstein build his Monster from?	Human body parts.
What is Victor Frankenstein’s profession?	Scientist.
Why does <b>UFO</b> need capital letters?	It is an <b>acronym</b> .
Apart from at the start of a sentence, when does <b>I</b> need a capital letter?	When it is the <b>first-person pronoun</b> .
Why does “Great Expectations” need capital letters?	It is a <b>title</b> .
Why does <b>Arctic</b> need a capital letter?	It is a <b>proper noun</b> and the <b>name of a place</b> .
What word means: “conforming to expected standards of social or professional behaviour”?	<b>Ethical</b> .
What is the definition of “ <b>moral</b> ”?	“Concerned with principles of right and wrong or conforming to standards of behaviour and character based on those principles.”
What is the definition of “ <b>tragic</b> ”?	“Extremely mournful, melancholic or pathetic; dreadful, calamitous, disastrous, or fatal.”
What word means: “a distinguishing characteristic or quality, especially or one’s personal nature”	<b>Trait</b> .
What word means: “implied or inferred; suggested by something?”	<b>Implicit</b> .
