Each drop off and collection point will have a waiting area, with dot markers. Children and parents to wait on designated spots while queuing to enter. Please keep to one side so parents can continue to walk around the one-way system.

It is REALLY important that parents DO NOT arrive BEFORE 8.30am. If you do happen to arrive early, please remain in your car or line up on the pavements at 2M intervals. Please only queue up one side of the gate (away from the car park).

The end of the day

Pick up time will be extended to support social distancing and to stagger the number of people leaving the site at one time. Parents are able to pick their child up between 2.50pm and 3.15pm via the one-way system. At the end of the day children will be dismissed from the same external door they were dropped off at.

Parents may need to wait on the designated spots outside each classroom. An adult will wait on each external door to dismiss each child when their parent arrives. All children to stay in their classroom until their parent arrives.

It is REALLY important that parents DO NOT arrive on site before 2.50pm. Please adhere to social distancing when waiting to come onto site.

It is REALLY important that you keep your child with you at all times and DO NOT let them run ahead of you whilst on school site or mix with other children.

It is REALLY important that you do not congregate outside of the school to talk. The national restrictions are still in force.

In the morning KS2 pupils enter the school site via the top gate on Dunyeats Road and walk round the back of the Year 5 classes to enter via their external classroom door.

Children need to wait socially distanced at least 1m apart should it get over crowded or busy at any given time - **children should NOT arrive before 8.30am so that they can go straight to their classroom and not have to queue or at risk of overcrowding.**

At the end of the day children will be dismissed from the same external door that they entered the school building and exit via the student walkway around the car park out of the student entrance onto Dunyeats Road. Pupils will not be able to wait for peers and expected to walk with no more than 1 other pupil to and from school.

If they are being collected by an adult from school site, we ask that adults wait by the student entrance gate on Dunyeats Road and DO NOT enter the school car park area. If you are waiting to collect your child you need to ensure the government guidelines for social distancing are adhered to.

Year 5 will be dismissed at 3.15pm

Year 6 will be dismissed at 3.10pm

KS3 pupils access the school site via the walkway on Dunyeats Road and walk round the side of the car park to their allocated entrance following the one-way system. If they arrive prior to 8.30am they need to queue single file on a designated floor marking to ensure they are socially distanced. We do ask that they do not arrive prior to 8.30am to avoid any risk of overcrowding or queuing in poor weather conditions.
