<p>Q&A</p>	<p>I am concerned that 10 minutes is a small window to get all pupils into school if they are to socially distance. We have taken advice from BCP and looked into other school plans to see how they are starting and finishing their school day. I think initially we have to trial it this way and we will continue to assess and adapt as we go. By accessing the school site directly via the external doors we could hopefully get pupils flowing round the one way system without the bottle neck effect of using one entrance/exit. We will have senior leaders and members of staff who do not have a form group out on duty in the mornings to both support pupils to socially distance but also gain a view of how effectively and ineffectively the system works. This is all new to us and we are happy to make changes where needed for the safety of our pupils and staff.</p> <p>Can you confirm if there is going to be a provision for siblings who will need to walk home together when their finishing times are different? Any child that needs to wait for their sibling will be able to do so in their classroom. <p>Q&A</p>	<p>Can they wear trainers with their uniform? Yes, but only for the first 6 weeks. This is because we will be doing some activity every day and so we felt it would be more appropriate. <p>Q&A</p>	<p>Why can't they bring in plastic lunch boxes as bringing paper bags means no ice pack and what if they don't eat all their lunch? Our decision to not bring in lunchboxes <u>for the first 6 weeks</u> is for a number of reasons. Firstly this system has worked particularly well over the recent period. Lost property, which is a significant issue across both schools, has been minimal – we feel this affords us another safety level as all lost property would need to end up in the same place and cross contamination is a risk factor. Secondly we are trying to avoid is 'stuff' unnecessarily being brought in and out of school. If a pupil does not eat</p>		

their lunch they can keep it in school for the next day (assuming it will keep fresh). If pupils bring in too much equipment we would need to use cloakrooms and that means that the potential for any cross contamination as well as social distancing issues is huge – we are trying to avoid this.

What if pupils have keys or mobile phones? Pupils are more than welcome to bring these items into school. Phones, if brought into school will be collected by the tutor at registration and will be kept in the office during the day for safe keeping. They will be handed out (and wiped) at the end of the day. This is an identified area of risk as they would need to be kept together and whilst we can clean them whilst collecting and giving out it is not risk free. Therefore I would ask that unless your child really needs their phone it should not be brought into school.

What about if girls need to bring sanitary products? We have made the decision to provide a range of sanitary products in all toilets for girls. These will be stored in the toilets themselves and will be available for girls to use in school. We will also provide spare underwear should it be needed. If your daughter would prefer to bring in their own supplies, we would ask that it is brought in in a small toiletries bag or pencil case. This can then be taken straight to the toilets when they arrive in school and can be stored there. We are still operating a system where only 2 pupils maximum are in the toilets at the same time so we are confident this will enable pupils to access any supplies they need discreetly.

If children aren't allowed bag how are they expected to carry folder, coat, drink and lunch when walking to school? Pupils will be wearing their coat. They are encouraged to leave water bottles in school (they can be rinsed out easily at the end of each day). This should mean that most days they are carrying a folder and a lunch bag. If pupils are really struggling they could use a plastic bag which can be taken home in a pocket. They should only need to bring their folder home with them every day.

What if it is raining and their lunch is in a paper bag? We are ever hopeful that the first 6 weeks will be pleasant weather. However if the weather is not kind then you may need to use a plastic bag. The reason we asked for paper bags is because of the damage to the environment but we also need to be pragmatic in poor weather conditions.
